VOLUNTEER APPLICATION FEE

All 4-H volunteers need to enroll/re-enroll annually. The volunteer application fee is **\$10.00**. This fee will pay for background screening.

Texas has more than 550,000 youth who are involved in 4-H experiences each year and we are pleased that you have decided to join 4-H! Here is some information about our enrollment process and how we need your partnership in getting your membership entered and approved. All membership records change to an inactive status in August. The Texas 4-H year officially starts on September 1 but enrollment opens on August 15th. Texas 4-H is for kids of almost any age – grades K-2 can be in Clover Kids if offered in your area. From 3rd-12th grades, you can be a regular 4-H member.

Enrollment instructions vary by county, so check with your local county office for more information.

2 FIND A CLUB
4-H Clubs are groups of youth and volunteers who meet on a regular basis.

3 FIND A PROJECT
Learn about topics that interest you. These are referred to as members projects.

4 ENROLL IN TEXAS 4-H
Signup on 4Honline after you have found a club and project that is right for you!

ABOUT 4HONLINE

- 4HOnline is the official registration system for adult and youth members directly involved with 4-H.
- 4HOnline is a partnership between the 4-H family and the local county office.
- 4HOnline is a secured system that is in compliance with the PCI Security Standards Council. Texas 4-H nor 4HOnline shares or sells any personal information to third party vendors without your knowledge or permission.
- Each year at the start of the enrollment cycle all 4-H membership in Texas goes to zero and everyone must re-enroll. This process is based on federal accounting policies.

WHAT TO KNOW

- Most questions can be answered by calling the local county office. (counties.agrilife.org)
- An approved youth or adult member record means a person is officially enrolled with Texas 4-H.
- An approved youth or adult member record means a person can register for state or district level events.
- Adult volunteers are required to be screened through the Texas A&M Agrilife Extension Volunteer Standards every three years. The screening process can take up to two weeks.
- A youth that is 8 years old and going into the 3rd grade must wait until September 1st to enroll for proper fees to be accessed. The Texas 4-H year officially starts on September 1.

The system will send automatic notifications to the family email address in the system.



Quality Counts Verification will be part of the entry process in ALL major shows. This means youth exhibitors will need to demonstrate their knowledge of the Six Pillars of Character and the Eight Core Concepts presented in the Quality Counts Curriculum.

To do this they will need to pass an online test and acquire a Quality Counts Verification number. All Major Livestock Shows in Texas will require Quality Counts Verification at the time of entry. This means youth need to be verified prior to entry in the fall of 2023.

Exhibitors must be verified once as a Junior (3rd - 5th), once as an Intermediate (6th - 8th), and once as a Senior (9th - 12th). Please see instructions below.





Quality Counts Enrollment Instructions

1. To begin, go to: <https://www.texaslivestockvalidation.com/qc/qcregister.aspx>



Helpful Hint: We recommend using Mozilla Firefox as your internet source (Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, and Safari may work in some instances but are NOT suggested). Also, please make sure your browser (Firefox) has JavaScript and Cookies enabled. For desktop computers, you must have Adobe Flash Player 10.1 or greater installed.

2. Register by entering your information then click "Submit Registration"

Helpful Hint: It is very important to choose BOTH your 4-H and FFA chapter regardless of which you think you will show through!

Helpful Hint: For grade level, please enter the grade you will be entering (if between May- August) or enter your current grade, depending on the time of year you are registering in Quality Counts.

3. This will trigger an email from texasyouthlivestock@ag.tamu.edu to keep for your records.

Helpful Hint: Do not delete this email as it contains a Return Link that you will NEED to come back to the course at any time.

4. Staying on the website, click "Proceed to Curriculum", you will be directed to the QC curriculum website, AgriLife Learn.

5. The course is free, so click the blue Add to Cart button.

6. Click Create an account under the log in button if you do not already have an account with AgriLife Learn.

Helpful Hint: You must create or have an account on AgriLife Learn, this is necessary to be able to leave and come back to the curriculum as many times as needed!

7. Click "View Cart" and then click "Proceed to Checkout".

8. Select the option that states, "No, I want to purchase this course for myself."

9. Check the box next to "I agree with the Terms of Use," then click Next.

10. To access your course, follow one of the 2 options below:

a. Click the "View my Order" button and then click on the link next to "Access Course:"

b. Navigate to the USER PROFILE icon in the top right corner of the screen and select "My Courses" in the dropdown menu.

11. Select Quality Counts and then choose your Age Bracket according to your school grade as of August 31 of the current year.

12. Click "Launch Unit" to begin the course!

Helpful Hint: The course will take approximately 2 hours to complete. You may leave and come back to the course using the Return Link (Step 3).

13. Once you complete the course, you will click the blue "Click here to Proceed to Test" button.

Helpful Hint: You must complete the exam once you start it, but you can take it as many times as needed to achieve an 80% or higher.

14. Once you pass the Exam, your Quality Counts number will appear under the Quality Counts Status Information box at the bottom of the page. You will also receive an email from texasyouthlivestock@ag.tamu.edu containing your Quality Counts number.

15. Congratulations! You have completed the Quality Counts Journey and your Quality Counts number is ready for livestock entries!

TEXAS FARM BUREAU 2023 CLOVER CASH TEXAS 4-H GRANT PROGRAM

Project Overview:

Texas Farm Bureau's Clover Cash grant program was created to support Texas 4-H programs at the county, district, and state levels. These programs should strive to help students understand the importance of advocating for agriculture. Students should also gain an appreciation and better understanding of where their food, fuel, and fiber come from. Qualifying projects will provide a hands-on experience for all members involved.

Eligibility Requirements:

- County Extension Agents
- District 4-H Specialists
- State 4-H staff responsible for any state level 4-H program
- Adult leaders of any county 4-H club
 - Must provide a letter of support from their County Extension Agent recognizing them as a valid Texas 4-H club

Project and Application Guidelines:

- Projects should be based on an agricultural concept. Preference will be given to those projects that are hands-on agricultural learning activities.
- Students must be directly engaged in the educational component.
- A timeline of the project and a list of all community partners must be listed on the application.
- The application must contain a detailed budget with estimated expenses.
- Applications will be accepted from County Extension Agents or Adult Leaders.
- Grant checks will be made payable to an organization, not an individual.

Grant Amounts Available:

- At the state level, three grants of up to \$2,000 each will be awarded.
- At the district level, four grants of up to \$1,500 each will be awarded.
- At the county level, four grants of up to \$500; four grants of up to \$750; and three grants of up to \$1,000 each will be awarded.

Fund Disbursement and Project Reporting:

Successful applicants will receive their funds once winners are announced October 13, 2023. Grant recipients will be required to submit a final report electronically due to Texas Farm Bureau by October 14, 2024. Texas Farm Bureau strongly encourages program leaders to submit photos and/or short video clips in electronic form, as well as appropriate photo releases.

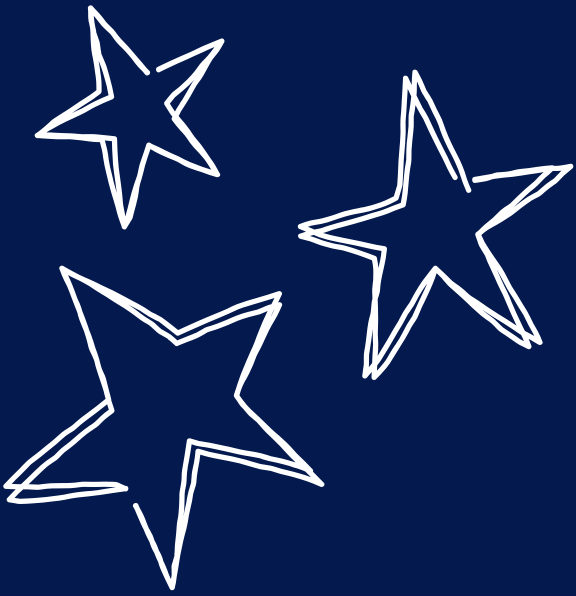

Frio County 4-H Claybuster Madison Brown, Coleton Trenklebach of Bandera , Kennedy Thompson - Uvalde County and Carson Schultz from Nueces County, earned several medals during competition at the 2023 4-H Shooting Sports National Championships in Grand Island, Nebraska. There were 42 other states represented at the event. The four youths are members of the shotgun team representing the entire state of Texas at the event.

On the first day of the competition, the team took 1st place in Sporting Clays with a 251.

On the second day of competition, the team persevered through extremely windy conditions and took first place in Skeet with a 296.

Carson Schultz shot a perfect 100/100, Kennedy Thompson 99/100, Coleton Trenklebach 97/100, and Madison Brown 94/100.

On the third day, the team competed in Trap and came in 4th place with a 281. Madison Brown 94/100, Coleton Trenklebach 94/100, Carson Schultz 93/100, Kennedy Thompson 91/100.

Overall Kennedy Thompson is the 2023 HOA National Champion Individual, Carson Schultz HOA Runner-Up, Coleton Trenklebach 4th and Madison Brown 7th. The shotgun team was crowned National Champions!

In the Overall Sweepstakes including all disciplines, Texas came in 2nd to Louisiana.

Team members were selected from many high school aged youths who submitted a lengthy application that highlighted not only their shooting ability, but also their academic achievement as well as other extracurricular activities and civic involvement.

The Frio County 4-H Claybusters has had an impressive number of its past and present members qualify for the state team over the years.

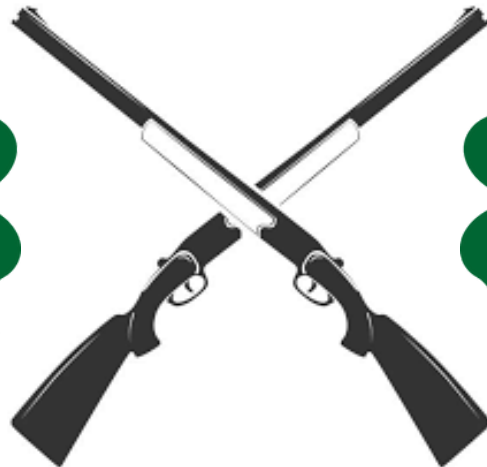

Why is UV safety important?

UV Safety is important to prevent skin cancer and other health problems caused by exposure to UV rays.

Tips to Keep Your Family Safe

- ❖ Reduce your risk of sun damage and skin cancer by **staying in the shade** under an umbrella, tree, or other shelter especially when the sun is the strongest between **11am and 3pm**
- ❖ **Drink lots of fluids like water**
- ❖ Use **sunscreen** that is at least SPF 15 before you go outside and **reapply** every two hours or after swimming or sweating. Not recommended for babies 6 months or younger.
- ❖ Wear **protective clothing** when outside
- ❖ Use **sunglasses** to protect your eyes from UV rays

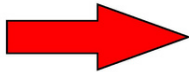

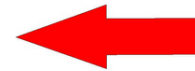

GENERAL RULES

1. Any 4-H or FFA member that resides in the state of Texas is eligible. Contestants must be a bona fide 4-H or FFA member enrolled in an accredited Texas school and be in compliance with UIL regulations.
2. Coaches may enter as many individuals or teams (a team will consist of at least 3 or no more than 4 members) as desired. The top three total scores of a team will make up the team score.
3. The contest will be divided into Junior and Senior divisions following 4-H rules as of January 1, 2000. Fourteen and over as of September 1, 2023 are considered Seniors, and thirteen and under as of September 1, 2023 are considered Juniors.
4. No talking between contestants or anyone else will be allowed. Violation will cause the team and individual to be disqualified.
5. A minimum of eight (8) classes will be judged and there will be a minimum of three (3) questions classes. Animals within a class will be designated by numbers: 1, 2, 3, and 4. Scores will be based on placings only. No oral reasons will be required. The questions class will be used to break individual and team ties.
6. Contestants will be allowed ten (10) minutes to judge each class of livestock. Contestants will be notified one (1) minute before the time is up.
7. Results and awards will be presented ASAP after contest in the Swine Barn. Please be present. The results as announced will be final. Awards will be presented to the Junior and Senior Divisions as individuals and as teams. Results will be available for coaches following awards presentation.
