VOLUNTEER APPLICATION FEE

All 4-H volunteers need to enroll/re-enroll annually. The volunteer application fee is **\$10.00.** This fee will pay for background screening

Texas has more than 550,000 youth who are involved in 4-H experiences each year and we are pleased that you have decided to join 4-H! Here is some information about our enrollment process and how we need your partnership in getting your membership entered and approved. All membership records change to an inactive status in August. The Texas 4-H year officially starts on September 1 but enrollment opens on August 15th. Texas 4-H is for kids of almost any age – grades K-2 can be in Clover Kids if offered in your area. From 3rd-12th grades, you can be a regular 4-H member.

- FIND A GLUB
 4-H Clubs are groups of youth and volunteers who meet on a regular basis.

ABOUT 4HONLINE

- 4HOnline is the official registration system for adult and youth members directly involved with 4-H.
- 4HOnline is a partnership between the 4-H family and the local county office.
- 4HOnline is a secured system that is in compliance with the PCI Security Standards Council. Texas 4-H nor 4HOnline shares or sells any personal information to third party vendors without your knowledge or permission.
- Each year at the start of the enrollment cycle all 4-H membership in Texas goes to zero and everyone must re-enroll. This process is based on federal accounting policies.

WHAT TO KNOW

- Most questions can be answered by calling the local county office. (counties.agrilife.org)
- An approved youth or adult member record means a person is officially enrolled with Texas 4-H.
- An approved youth or adult member record means a person can register for state or district level events.
- Adult volunteers are required to be screened through the Texas A&M Agrilife Extension Volunteer Standards every three years. The screening process can take up to two weeks
- A youth that is 8 years old and going into the 3rd grade must wait until September 1st to enroll for proper fees to be accessed. The Texas 4-H year officially starts on September 1.

If the family has moved to a NEW county in Texas, contact local county office to have the FAMILY PROFILE moved to the new county. Do not create a new profile.

The system will send automatic notifications to the family email address in the system.



Quality Counts Verification will be part of the entry process in ALL major shows. This means youth exhibitors will need to demonstrate their knowledge of the Six Pillars of Character and the Eight Core Concepts presented in the Quality Counts Curriculum.

To do this they will need to pass an online test and acquire a Quality Counts Verification number. All Major Livestock Shows in Texas will require Quality Counts Verification at the time of entry. This means youth need to be verified prior to entry in the fall of 2023.

Exhibitors must be verified once as a Junior (3rd - 5th), once as an Intermediate (6th - 8th), and once as a Senior (9th - 12th). Please see instructions below.





Quality Counts Enrollment Instructions

1. To begin, go to: https://agrilifelearn.tamu.edu/s/login/

Helpful Hint: We recommend using Mozilla Firefox or Google Chrome as your internet source.

2. Click "Create an account" underneath the blue Log In button if you do not already have an account with AgriLife Learn. If you do have an AgriLife Learn account, log in at this time.

Helpful Hint: You must create or have an account on AgriLife Learn, this is necessary to be able to leave and come back to the curriculum as many times as needed!

- 3. After logging into your account, type "Quality Counts" into the search bar to find the course.
- 4. On the Quality Counts page, under "Quality Counts Level" click on the drop-down menu to select your grade level: Junior (Grades 3-5), Intermediate (Grades 6-8), or Senior (Grades 9-12).

Helpful Hint: For grade level, please enter the grade you will be entering (if between May- August) or enter your current grade, depending on the time of year you are registering in Quality Counts.

- 5. Once you've selected your grade level, click the blue "Add to Cart" button. The course is free, but you must go through the checkout process to enroll.
- 6. Click "View Cart" and then click "Proceed to Checkout".
- 7. Check the box next to "I agree with the Terms of Use," then click Next.
- 8. To access your course, click the "View my Order" button and then click on the link next to "Access Course:"
- 9. At the bottom of the Welcome page, click on "Course Materials"
- 10. Take the Exhibitor Survey to begin the course.

Helpful Hint: It is very important to choose BOTH your 4-H and FFA chapter regardless of which you think you will show through!

11. Once you have completed the survey, copy the access code provided to you.

Helpful Hint: This is NOT your QC number that verifies your course completion. This is a one-time code to open up the learning materials. You will also be emailed this code from surveys@ag.tamu.edu.

- 12. Click the arrow in the top, right-hand corner of your screen to move forward.
- 13. Click the blue "Start Quiz" button and then enter the access code.
- 14. After submitting the access code, move through the course content by clicking on the arrow in the top, right-hand corner of your screen.

Helpful Hint: The course will take approximately 2 hours to complete. You may leave and come back to the course at any time by logging into your AgriLife Learn account.

15. Once you complete the course materials, click "Final Exam" to take the exam.

Helpful Hint: You must complete the exam once you start it, but you can take it as many times as needed to achieve 80% or higher.

- 16. Once you pass the exam, you will receive an email from texasyouthlivestock@ag.tamu.edu with your VERIFIED Quality Counts NUMBER. It is important you check for and keep this message. You may also contact your CEA/AST to obtain your number if you did not receive the email.
- 17. Congratulations! You have completed the Quality Counts Journey and your Quality Counts number is ready for livestock show entries!

Hill Adams Youth Service Award Coach Tommy Allmand Frio County 4-H Claybusters

Tommy Allmand of Pearsall, Texas was inducted into the NSCA Hall of Fame as recipient of the Hill Adams Service Award for significant contributions to the involvement and development of youth shooters in sporting clays and the NSCA on October 26, 2023.

Tommy has served youth in sporting clays at the grassroots level for over 30 years and is best known for his work with the Texas 4-H program. He has been coach for Frio County 4-H since 1991, state 4-H Match Director and target setter since 2020, and instructor for 4-H coaching work-shops for 20 years, and a leader in 4-H Whiz -Bang. He has set sporting clays targets for the National 4-H Championships for the past three years.

In addition to his work with 4-H, Tommy has served on the San Antonio Rodeo Junior Shoot-Out Committee as Chairman of Field Operations since it started 12 years ago and assisted with Waco Heart of Texas Fair and Rodeo youth shoot for several years. He hosts youth shooting mini-camps around the state. He's currently a Level 1 NSCA Certified Instructor working toward Level 2.

The former trap shooter started shooting sporting clays in 1990. He had the good fortune to be a student used for instructor training in an NSCA Level 3 course taught by Roger Silcox and learned many lessons he still uses in his teaching today. He also learned from Charlie Wilson, a former recipient of this award, working with him on TPWD Whiz-Bang and other programs for many years.

"I've had the pleasure to work with many coaches and shooters and have taken a little from each of them, "says Tommy. "I've also had the opportunity to work with many people in the 4-H program who have been a big part of me receiving this recognition. It takes a great team of volunteers to keep and organization successful."

In his personal life, Tommy enjoys a career in wireless communications and surveillance systems. He is married to Cherie Allmand and has one daughter, Katie Boatright, two sons, Justin and Luke Allmand and a grandson, Anson Boatright.

While Tommy has experienced success in his own shooting, his most treasured milestones have been helping youth shooters and seeing them succeed. "I get the more pleasure out of helping others excel in the sport and helping youth shooters learn the life lessons that can be taught through shooting, " says Tommy. "it could be in the form of coaching a young shooter or helping a group of adults get a new 4-H club started and teaching them how to move forward and help more kids."
